Curbside Address Not Required

Claims have been made by some
companies, that police and fire
department will not provide ser-
vice if they cannot see the ad-
dress of the home, and that it's
recommended that homeowners
pay for the inexpensive service
of curbside painting. If that claim
is made by a flyer, check with
the police or fire department to
verify the claim, but according
to local suburban police and fire
departments, it is not true that
homeowners have to have their
addresses painted on the curb.
It is recommended that
homeowners ensure the number
on their residence can be seen
easily from the street, but
curbside painting is not neces-
sary.
