### Mission Statement

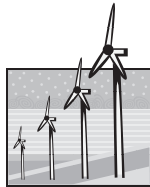

### Local Fact

The Wheat Ridge Volunteer Fire Department was originally formed through the efforts of George Hively, a local blacksmith, who solicited funds from merchants and private citizens to purchase a new 1926 Dodge fire truck with an on-board chemical fire extinguishing system. He formed a firefighting force consisting of several local businessmen and high school students. When someone in the community needed the fire department, they called the blacksmith shop by telephone. Hively then sounded an electrical siren on the roof of his shop. The schoolboys and local merchants would run to the shop, man the truck, and race to the fire. Fire protection in Wheat Ridge remained like this until 1946 when the State Legislature passed a bill allowing for the formation of taxing fire protection districts and the Wheat Ridge Fire Protection District was formed. All firemen of the Wheat Ridge Fire Department have always been volunteers. The only full-time staff members consist of: District Manager, Administrative Assistant, Fleet Maintenance Supervisor and Fire Marshall.

**Notes from  
Consolidated Mutual**

Consolidated Mutual is NOT offering rebates for the replacement of toilets or clothes washers with more water-efficient models. However, a portion of the residential customers MAY qualify for Denver Water's rebate program if they are served with water that Consolidated Mutual Water Company acquires from Denver. You may qualify if your water account number begins with one of the following prefixes: A, B, CA, CB, D, E, F, GA, GB, H, I, J, K, LA, LB, N, P, R, S, TD.

These Denver water customers who replace toilets and clothes washers with water-efficient models will get cash back. The program offers a \$100 rebate for each older model toilet replaced with one certified ultra-low-volume (ULV). The rebate is limited to two toilets per household. A \$125 rebate is available to customers who replace traditional top loading clothes washers with horizontal axis/front loading washers. The rebate is limited to one washer per household.
