### Just A Few Outcomes From A Very Interesting Legislative Session

#### Employers can file electronically

Rep. Ramey Johnson ( R ) Lakewood successfully sponsored a bill (HB03-1222) that enables employers to electronically file documents with the Division of Workers' Compensation. Filing electronically, however, is not mandatory.

#### Identify Theft Protection

HB03-1271, introduced by Rep. Cheri Jahn (D) Lakewood and signed into law by the Governor prohibits a merchant from recording the entire credit card number in accepting a credit card as payment.

#### Legislation to Allow Reasonable Display of the U.S. Flag

Senate Bill 235 has been approved by the Legislature and has been sent to the Governor. This bill would allow reasonable display of one U.S. Flag in covenant controlled communities. Flagpoles remain subject to applicable architectural covenants and guidelines.

#### State Legislature Requests Homeowner Associations to Amend Governing Documents

Both the State House and Senate approved a non-binding resolution asking Homeowner Associations to review their governing documents, evaluate the

effects of their governing documents on landscaping and any other activities that place a burden on the state's water resources, and to then make amendments to encourage and promote responsible water conservation measures, soil enhancement and xeriscaping.

#### Lost Transportation \$\$\$

HB 1184 introduced by Rep. Fran Coleman (D), Denver would have lowered the blood alcohol level to 0.08 grams of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood. This failed in House Transportation. SB 125 by Sen. Ken Arnold ( R ), Westminster would have lowered the blood level for DUI status, eliminated Colorado's open alcohol container in a vehicle and made not wearing a seat belt a primary offense. Fail in Senate Appropriations

Because Colorado is out of compliance with federal highway funding mandates, the state has lost \$50 million in federal funds for highway maintenance and construction.

## Notes from The Consolidated Mutual Water Company

Consolidated Mutual is NOT offering rebates for the replacement of toilets or clothes washers with more water-efficient models. However, a portion of the residential customers MAY qualify for Denver Water's rebate program if they are served with water that Consolidated Mutual Water Company acquires from Denver. You may qualify if your water account number begins with one of the following prefixes: A, B, CA, CB, D, E, F, GA, GB, H, I, J, K, LA, LB, N, P, R, S, TD.

These Denver water customers who replace toilets and clothes washers with water-efficient models will get cash back. The program offers a \$100 rebate for each older model toilet replaced with one certified ultra-low-volume (ULV). The rebate is limited to two toilets per household.

A \$125 rebate is available to customers who replace traditional top loading clothes washers with horizontal axis/front loading washers. The rebate is limited to one washer per household.

The program is open to all single and multi-family residential customers in Denver Water's service area. If your water account begins with one of the listed prefixes above, contact Denver Water at 303-628-6330 or 303-628-6159 or on the internet at DenverWater.org

A clarification of a few of the

misunderstood restrictions.

Personal vehicles may be washed at the owner's home on the designated watering day only with a bucket or a hose equipped with a positive shut-off nozzle but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Property owners who have a private well (or other alternative water source) on their property may use that water at will but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. and must display a Consolidated "Well Water" sign, have a dual supply agreement and install a backflow prevention device

Washing driveways and sidewalks is prohibited except for health or safety.

Fountains, waterfalls and ponds may not be operated if water is sprayed into the air.

Restaurants shall not serve water except at the request of the customer and must comply with Denver Water's signage program.

Water Waste is defined as water pooling or flowing into gutters and storm drains, applying irrigation water to paved surfaces, failing to repair broken sprinkler heads, using water instead of a broom to clean paved surfaces, watering during rain or high wind and using excessive amounts of water. Use of a rain sensor is advised.
