New Laws

If you have a child younger than 6, and you don't have a booster seat, you better start looking for one. A new state law requires all 4- and 5-year-olds who are not 55 inches tall to ride in a child booster seat. If they don't, their parents or guardians could face the consequences. New Public School Law Effective August 6, 2003

S.B. 03-36 Graduation requirement - course on civil government - community forum. Makes satisfactory completion of a course on the civil government of the United States and the state of Colorado a requirement for high school graduation in public schools. Applies to each student entering the first year of high school on and after August 6, 2003.

Help Fight The Bite



September is still a dangerous time for mosquitoes. West Nile Virus is a disease spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. Infection can result in a severe and sometimes fatal illness known as West Nile encephalitis - an inflammation of the brain.

West Nile Virus Prevention Tips

Mosquitoes lay their eggs on the surface of the water, and prefer to breed in water that has collected in artificial containers such as buckets, barrels, dog dishes and birdbaths.

Do Your Part

Help prevent mosquitoes from breeding by:

- Turning over or removing containers in your back yard where rainwater collects. This includes flowerpots and trays.
- Clean out roof gutters and downspouts screens regularly.
- Eliminate standing water that has accumulated on tarps and flat roofs.
- If you find a dead bird, do not handle it. Call your local animal control authority.
