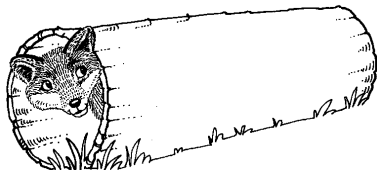

## Take precautions. Avoid unwanted visitors

As cities along the Front Range grow, wild animals are often displaced. Some such as skunks, raccoons, fox and the wiley coyote seem to prosper in newly built subdivisions. Here are tips to help avoid wild animal encounters.

- Keep garbage in airtight containers inside your garage or storage area. Clean trashcans with ammonia or bleach occasionally to reduce odors that attract wild animals.

- Do not leave pet food outdoors at night. Raccoons, coyotes and ravens love pet food.



- Place garbage outside for pickup the day of collection, not the night before.

- Many bears have learned the trick of opening garbage cans. If you live in an area favored by bears, invest in a bear-proof garbage can. A new regulation now requires residents and businesses to remove trash and other bear attractants. Failure to do so: a \$68 fine for each violation.

- Cats can become part of the food chain when allowed to roam. The presence of free-roaming cats may cause predators to remain near homes. Coyotes can be serious predators on cats and small dogs.

- Screen fireplace chimneys and furnace, attic and dryer vents and keep dampers closed to avoid "drop-in" guests.
